### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

We have just enough to give this award one more time, and then we will have to use our savings, if we are to continue doing the honorarium.

That is too long, and this group needs fresh leadership. If we choose to continue, I would like for you all to consider another person for the job of President.

We will continue this discussion when we get together on the 13th, where our program will be given by Dale Sutton, who plans to share with us his experiences at the Annual Convention of the AWCI held last month in Seattle this year. Please come out and join us, and let us enjoy our time together!
